



Options for hosting a Numicon course

Option 1 - Fee \$1500.00 + GST, includes travel and accommodation for courses outside of Auckland. (Auckland \$1000.00 plus GST)

The hosting school:

- Has the option of inviting neighbouring schools to attend to help offset the costs. Limit 30 people.
- The school provides a room with tables, a screen, data show projector and speakers suitable with the suitable lighting and temperature control
- Provides morning tea. (Participants bring their own lunch.)
- Provides Margi with a list of all the registrants- their names, schools or organisations and e-mail addresses on the day

If the school wants to invite other schools, then Numicon contributes by advertising through the Numicon website and by newsletter to mailing list members

Option 2 - No fee. Registrations are taken through the Numicon website

The hosting school:

- 1 staff member attends the day at no charge.
- Advertises the course in the local area through their own clusters and networks
- If 15 or more attend from outside the school, then there is no limit to the number of staff members to attend free of charge.
- Minimum number is 15 people to cover Numicon costs
- The school provides a room with tables, a screen, data show projector and speakers suitable with the right lighting and temperature control
- Provides morning tea. (Participants bring their own lunch.)
- Numicon contributes by advertising through the Numicon website and by newsletter to mailing list members

Course participants include

SENCO's, Early intervention staff from CCS, GSE, rural principals or rural staff, teachers, teacher aides, ECE teachers, RTLB, Support staff from GSE, special education advisors, parents, Speld and other learning tutors, parents and parent home educators.

Parents Information

A number of schools have found it beneficial to host a parent information evening where parents and other interested colleagues and neighbouring schools are invited to gain information about the Numicon programme and hear of its encouraging success.

Tasters

Many schools host Taster sessions where colleagues attend from other schools either for an after school workshop or for the first hour of the workshop when a course is hosted during the day. There is not fee for a Taster or fee applied to any attendees. The school can make this decision to cover any costs such as refreshments.
